REPORT OF THE ACTIVITIES CONDUCTED IN THE MONTH OF APRIL

Hand Impression Activity- The Hand Impression Tree Making Activity was conducted with UKG students. This activity not only encouraged their creativity but also helped to develop their fine motor skills and spatial awareness. The children thoroughly enjoyed the tactile experience of tracing their hands and creating their unique trees. The activity successfully engaged the students and provided them with a fun and memorable learning experience.







<u>Alphabet Bingo Activity</u>- Keeping students engaged and motivated while learning 'Alphabet Bingo Activity' was conducted for U.K.G. students. They had a blast while picking out letters and shouting "Bingo!" The game helped them get familiar with the alphabet, practice their letter sounds, and learn new words.







Sense Organ Activity- The students of class UKG were introduced to the five senses (senses of hearing, smell, touch, taste, and sight). In this activity, students made groups of different numbers with the pom-pom. Through this activity, they developed an understanding of place value.



<u>Tall and Short Ladder Activity-</u> Using ice cream sticks to make ladders of different heights was a fun activity for UKG students. Through this activity, they were able to visually compare and contrast the lengths. It helped them grasp the concept of tall and short more effectively.



Dhol Decoration Activity- On the occasion of Baisakhi, a Dhol Decoration Activity was conducted for the LKG class. Students decorated the dhol by using decorative materials. Engaging in such hands-on activities not only fosters a sense of appreciation for cultural traditions but also provides valuable opportunities for learning and skill development.



<u>Paste The Body Part Activity</u>- This activity was conducted for the students of Class LKG on the topic 'My Body Parts'. Each child was given the cutouts of the body parts. The students had to identify the parts and paste them in the right place. Through this activity, students learnt about the parts of the body and their importance. They discussed what each body part does.



Tearing and Pasting Activity - Tearing & Pasting Activity was conducted for the students of LKG on 16 April. 
