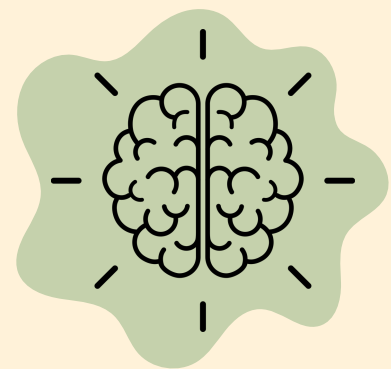
Then & Now..... and Looking Ahead

Through their ideas and innovation, our future will thrive.

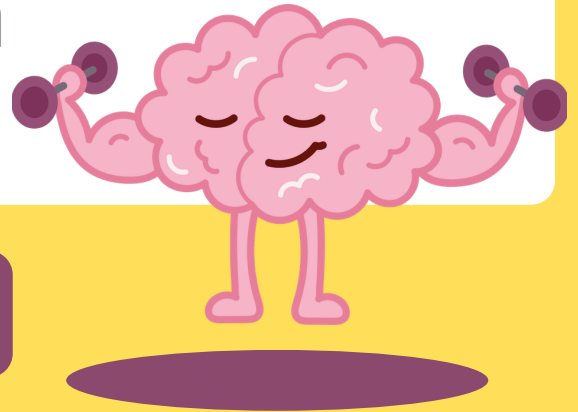

One Lesson School Taught Me

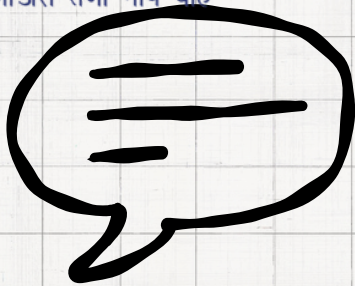

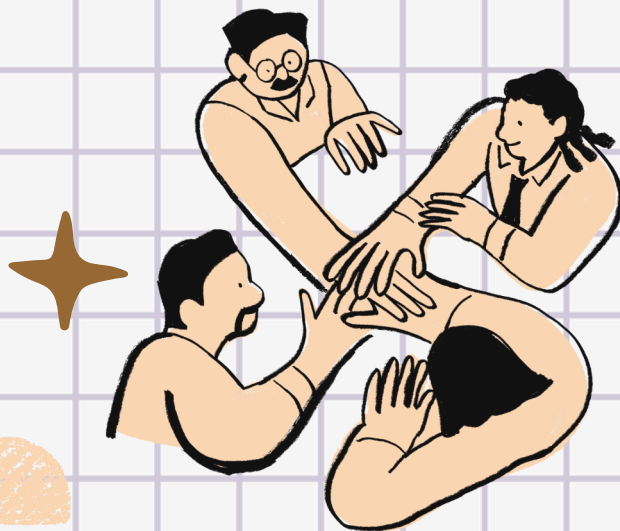
6. How did the blend of academics, co-curricular activities, and values at Ralli International School help you become a well-rounded individual?

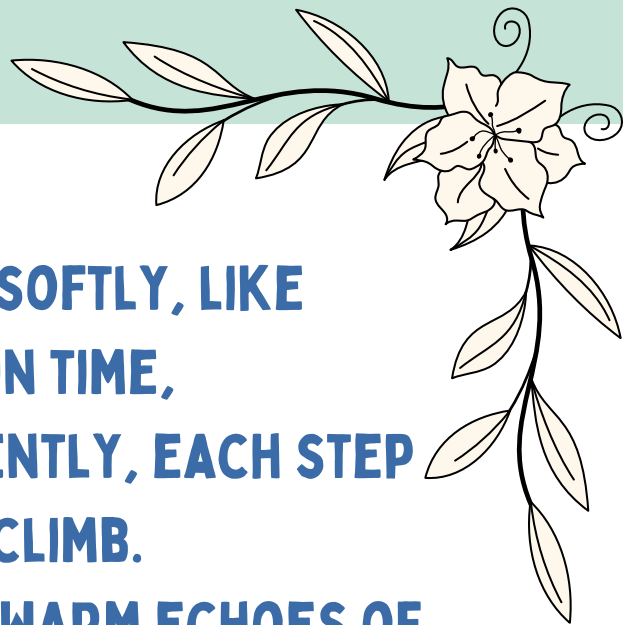

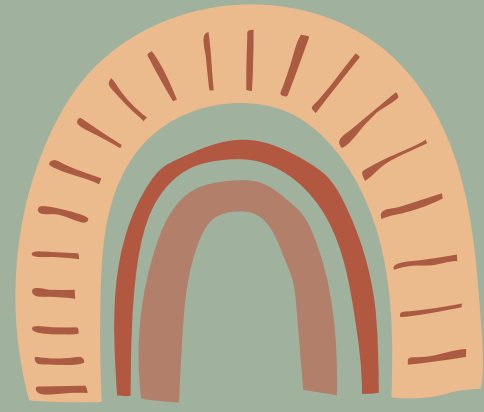
