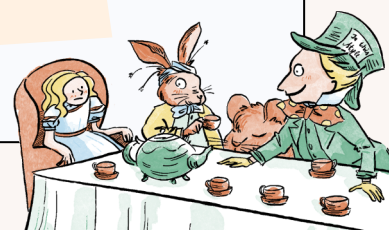

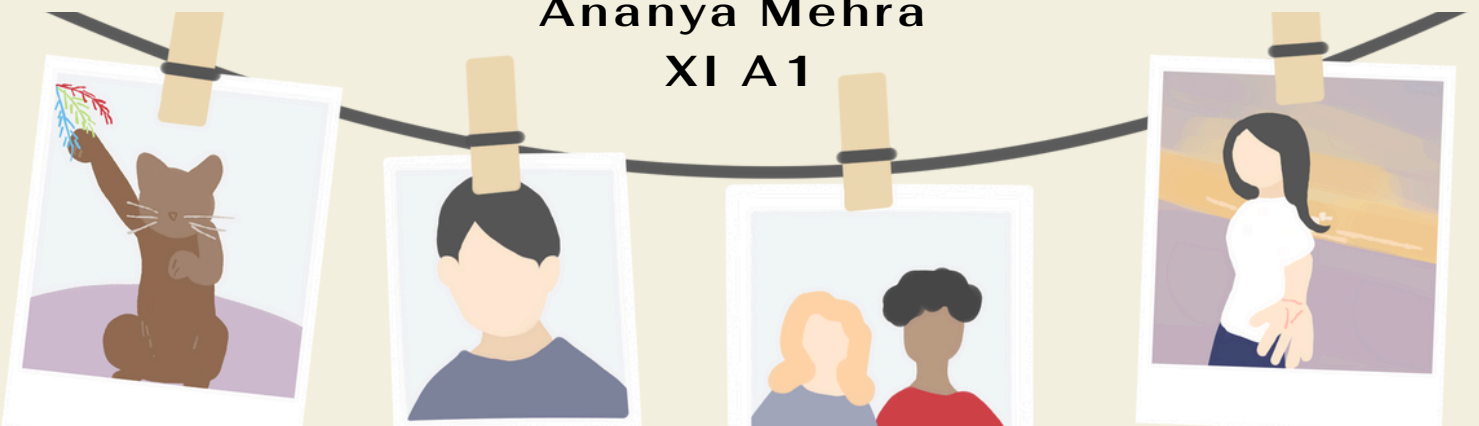
Snapshots of joy, in the classroom air

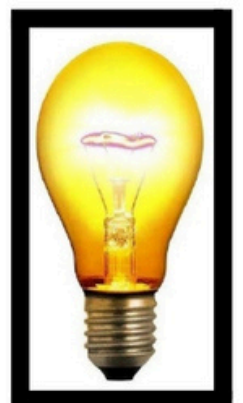
He tried 39th times and at his 40th time ,he succeeded in inventing what we call today a bulb.

Unforgettable Moments of My School Year

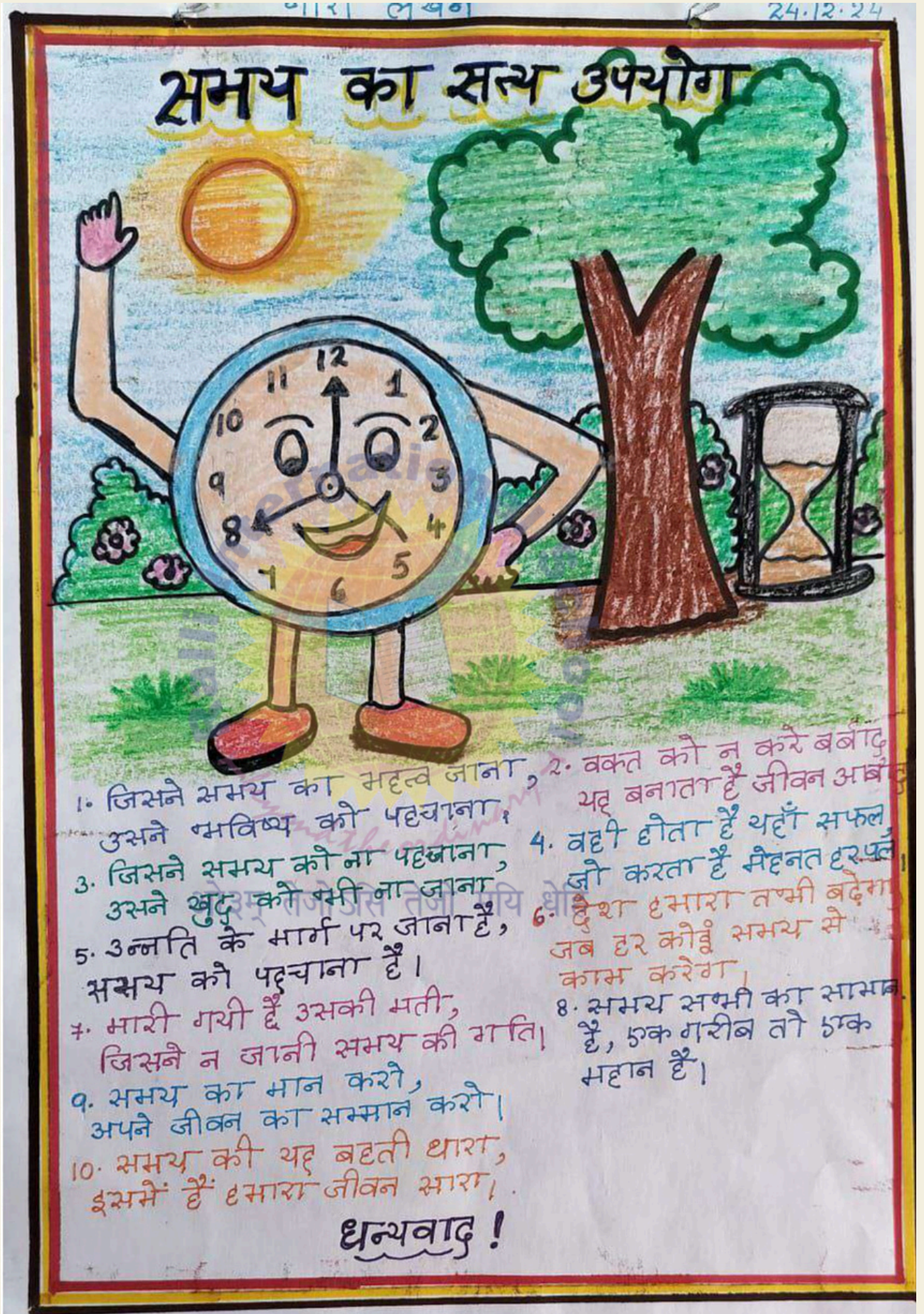

These memories will always hold a special place in my heart, reminding me of the incredible time I spent with my teachers and friends.

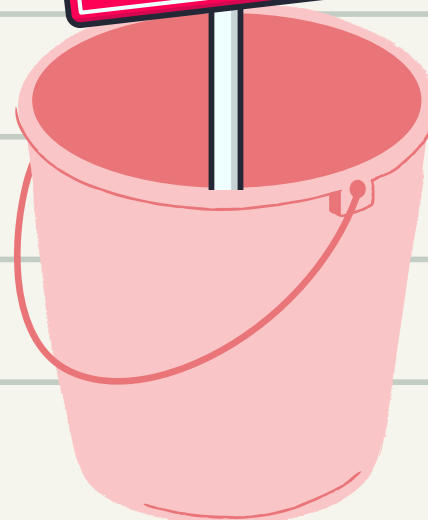

A Letter to My Future Self

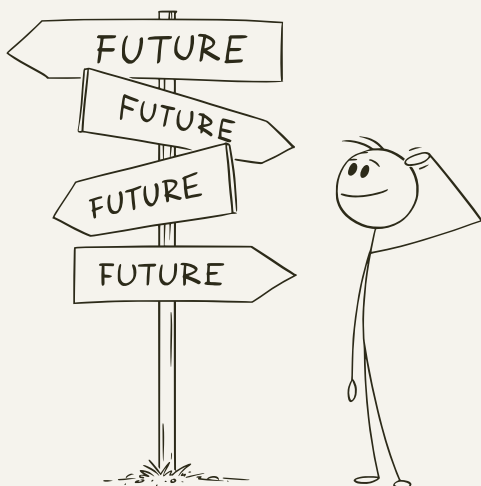

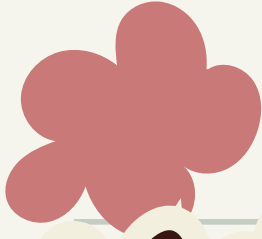

6. Could you share your career path after graduating?

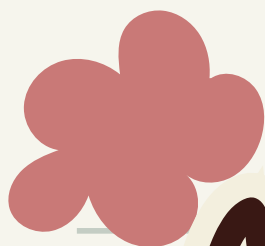

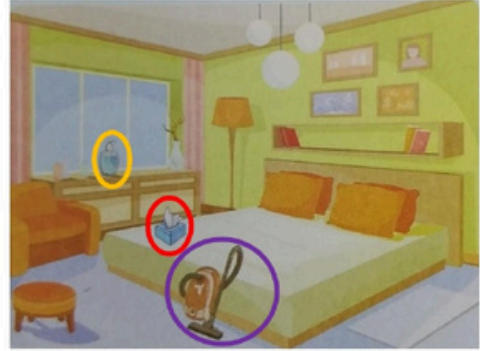
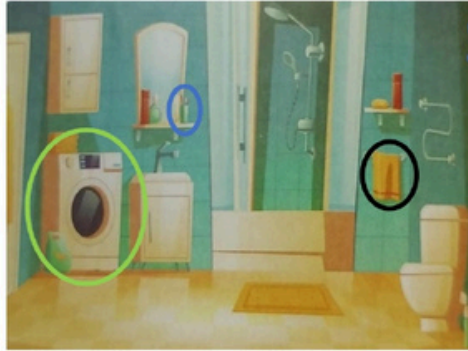
